The official number of people who speak French globally is around 300 million, which includes native speakers as well as those who speak French as a second language, and numerous French dialects.

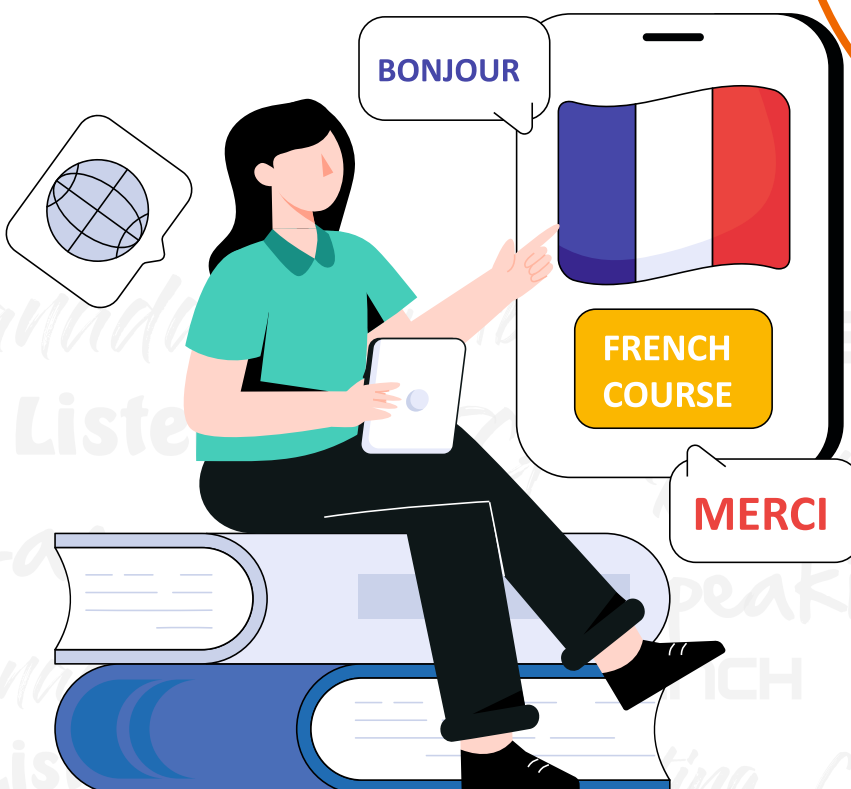

Can ask and answer basic questions about home, family, surroundings, etc. Can communicate in a basic way when the other person speaks slowly and clearly, and is ready to repeat or reformulate to help communication.</p>
<b>Elementary</b>	<b>A2</b>	<p>Can understand isolated phrases and common expressions that relate to areas of high personal relevance (like personal or family information, shopping, immediate environment, work). Can communicate during easy or habitual tasks requiring a basic and direct information exchange on familiar subjects. Can speak in a clear, detailed way on a number of subjects; express an opinion on current affairs, giving the advantages and disadvantages of the various options</p>
<b>Advanced</b>	<b>C1</b>	<p>Can understand a wide range of long and complex texts, including any sub textual or stylistic nuances. Can express him or herself freely and fluidly, without obviously fumbling for words. Can use the language effectively and fluently in a social, professional or academic context. ## TCF - Test de Connaissance du Français

It is the French Language Proficiency Test for international students to pursue further studies as well as comply with immigration purposes. It increases the chances of getting visa in Quebec-Canada, France and many other Francophone countries.

### EXAM STRUCTURE

The test – TCF is broadly divided into Compulsory Tests and Optional Tests. The Compulsory Tests are further divided into three sub-sections which have a total of 78 questions and stretch upto an hour and a half. (Approx.)

#### Compulsory Sections

### Test d'évaluation de français pour le Canada (TEF Canada)

The Test d'évaluation du français (TEF) is a test of fluency in French for non-native speakers. It is awarded by the CCIP (Chambre de commerce et d'industrie de Paris) - The Paris Chamber of Commerce. It is often required to be admitted into Universities and is recognized by the Federal Government of Canada as a proof of fluency in immigration procedures, and increases the chances of getting visa in Quebec-Canada, France and many other countries.

#### ORAL COMPREHENSION

40 min-60 questions

#### WRITTEN COMPREHENSION

60 min-50 questions

#### ORAL EXPRESSION

15 min-2 topics to cover

#### WRITTEN EXPRESSION

# POINTS FOR FRENCH UNDER VARIOUS SYSTEMS

## UNDER THE CRS POINT GRID:

### 1. Upto 25 points

If you score NCLC (Niveaux de compétence linguistique canadiens) 7 or higher in all four French language abilities (Listening, Speaking, Reading, Writing) and your English test score is CLB 4 or lower in all abilities.

### 2. Upto 50 points

If you score NCLC 7 or higher in all four French abilities and score CLB (Canadian Language Benchmark) 5 or higher in English, you can earn 50 additional points.

## TEF AND TCF EXAMS ARE ACCEPTED FOR FRENCH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

To be eligible under the Francophone category, NCLC 7 is required in all 4 categories of French.

**For example, in TEF Canada, to meet NCLC 7, you need to achieve the following Equivalence Ancien Score:**

 Speaking: 310+

 Listening: 249+

 Reading: 207+

 Writing: 310+

## FOR QUEBEC

On the 132-point grid, you need 50 points (For single applicant) & 59 points (For couple) to qualify for Quebec's immigration program (QSWP) & you can get up to 16 points for French.

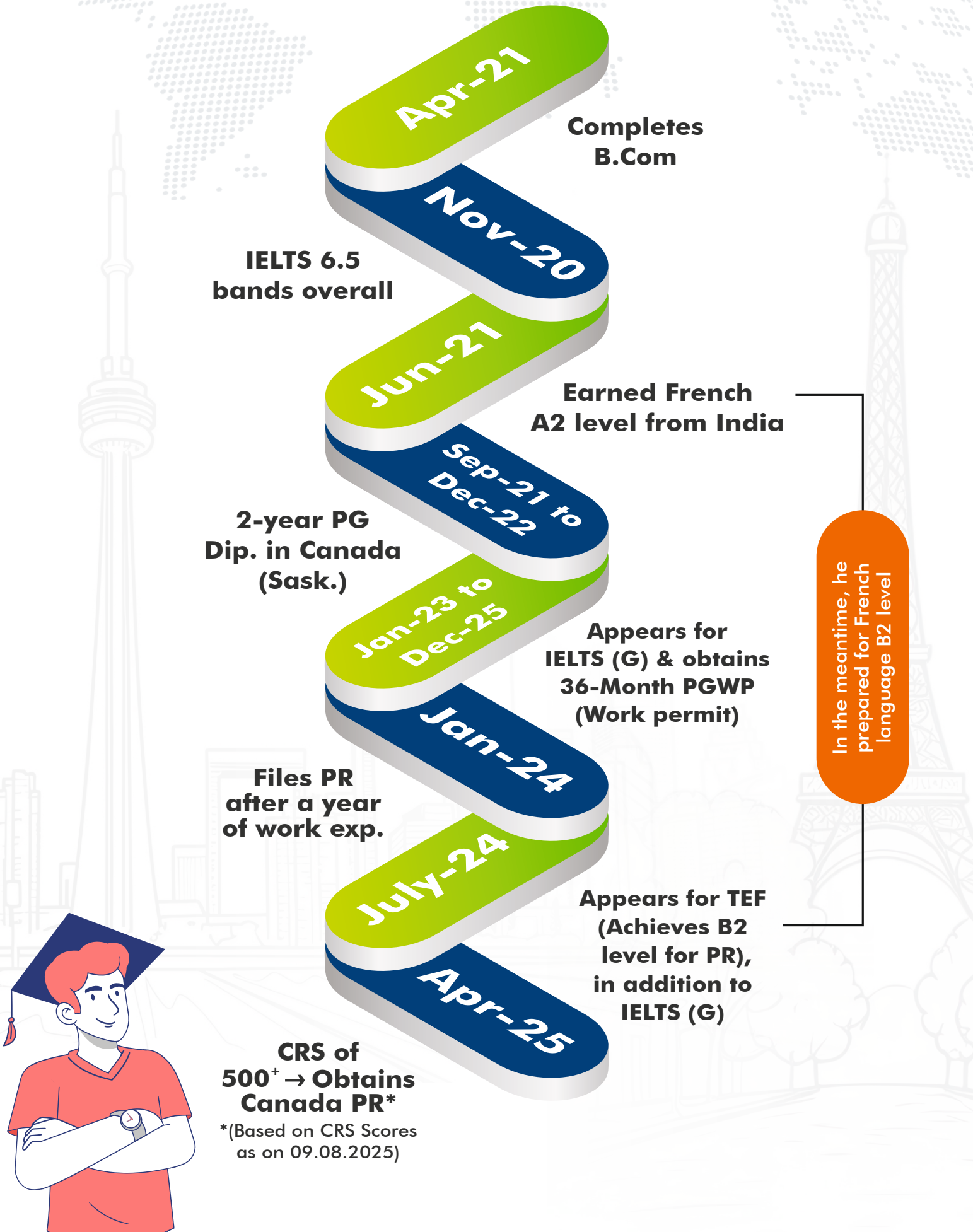

The **CRS (Comprehensive Ranking System)** score, that other-wise varies at all possible times in a given year, can still be easily met for a candidate who has appeared for French language test in Canada.

Even while applying for the **student visa** from India, a score in French language proficiency can boost an applicant's chances of receiving the **Canada student visa**.
